

I am sitting on our Patio writing this article in the glorious July sunshine, Covid restrictions have been eased and when I walk my little dog I can smell Barbecues cooking in gardens with people laughing, chatting, planning outings and holidays so it would appear that 'All is right with the world'

I appreciate that for many this is not the case as under the Lockdown businesses have been hit very hard and may not have survived, people have lost jobs and were unable to be furloughed causing worrying financial difficulties. Some folk have been poorly, schools and colleges closed and farmers have experienced devastating heavy storm showers that have ruined some of their crops so it is insensitive to state that 'all is well' other than to share some positive local church news with you and try to present the glass 'Half Full'

The Thaxted United Reformed Church has been without a minister for five years since David Vincent retired but now Mark Hayes from Saffron Walden has taken us under his wing whilst completing his Ministerial training at Westminster College Cambridge. Mark has for many years been CEO of a Christian Housing Association in south east London but retired in June this year.

During the long interregnum we have been loyally supported by visiting ministers and the Parish Church team so we have been well looked after but we have missed the communication and continuity of having a minister to share concerns and ideas, never more so than during these last eighteen months with the added pressures that Covid has brought causing isolation and emotional difficulties for many.

Mark will be available to speak to people that are struggling, be more of a presence in the community, lead our services for at least two Sundays a month, chair meetings and other events.

Mark and his wife Janet have some great ideas not only for the URC but to reach out into the community for example to try 'Messy Church' on a weekday afternoon after school hopefully starting in the Autumn when children and parents can come together and be creative with a whole range of Art and Craft materials enjoy a delicious tea and be

able to chat. They are enthusiastic to 'Reach out' but appreciate it will take time and realize that these last eighteen months with all the difficulties that many of us have 'switched off' to anything even vaquely to do with church.

Having said that we are starting on Sunday 12th September at 3pm "The Story' which is looking at the relationship between God and Humankind I am certain this will be very interesting so do come along to the URC have a cup of tea and join in the discussion.

Another idea suggested is to clear an area of the URC graveyard that is not used for burials and then develop a 'Wild flower garden' to create a space where people can sit quietly for reflection and perhaps find some peace in this very busy and often chaotic life.

We have a member of our congregation undertaking the URC accredited Lay Preaching course so she will be able to lead services when Mark is asked to preach elsewhere, plus we have two excellent organists who are available to play at our services whereas before we had been using a Digital Hymnal which is ok but nothing like the wonderful sound of the organ and now that we are able to sing once more our spirits have been lifted and so has the roof!! Suddenly our 'Cup overfloweth'

Sometimes it is so hard to be positive and 'Look Forward'. This past year or so has been a real test of that, even with this horrible Covid virus still causing alarm I share with you something written on the wall as you enter Addenbrookes Hospital "Whatever it is, it will pass"

Let's try as much as we can to keep looking forward and being positive which is highly infectious and making every effort to ensure that the 'glass is always half full'.

Our business, The Giddy Up Teacup, has been lucky to have a regular weekend pitch in front of the Windmill in Thaxted. We work from a beautifully converted horsebox and we're absolutely delighted with how our little business is progressing. More of that later. But we've often been asked why we chose to start our business from a horsebox. Well, it wasn't our first choice as we had our hearts set on a vintage WW2 ambulance with a business selling tea and sympathy for medicinal purposes (get it... still a great idea we think)! However, a vintage vehicle wasn't without its problems. Expensive to convert but of more concern was the reliability factor. To ensure customers were guaranteed our business would turn up, we had to look at other options and that's where the horsebox idea came into play. Towable behind our 4x4, it can pretty much go anywhere, and we wanted a business vehicle that offered versatility, flexibility and reliability while being able to adapt from a pretty teashop by day, The Giddy Up Teacup, to a hipster bar at night, our alter ego The Giddy Up Bar.

2020 was a write off due to Covid. However, we're delighted to report that since April, we've been back at the windmill most weekends selling Blake's Bakes, homemade cakes which are delicious! Our cakes, teas, coffees and cold drinks are all served on pretty vintage china – tea definitely tastes better in a china cup! We've also been lucky enough to meet Theresa Egan whose Thaxted based CakeHole business has provided us with some of our china, in particular the beautiful cake stands which Theresa makes here in Thaxted while raising money for Cancer Research. Our customers have been extremely generous buying Windmill merchandise and donating money for the Windmill Trust to help go towards running and repair costs of this beautiful building.

We've got several private functions booked this year. The Giddy Up Bar has been put to work at weddings and private parties. The Giddy Up Teacup has also been booked for celebratory vintage tea parties.

We've invested in an extension to the horsebox. David at Thaxted's Glendale Forge has worked wonders creating a removable structure that has enabled us to almost double the space at the back of the horsebox.

Finally, we have needed to grow the team and have taken on new members of staff who will work on a rota basis for us. Our son Nick and his girlfriend Mery, who were so instrumental in helping us out in 2020, have now got really busy with their own jobs but I'm sure they'll still be around from time to time. The new team have all been amazing and an asset to our team.

REAPING THE HARVEST

Last year the Country Land and **Business Organisation estimated** that 80,000 agricultural workers would be needed to help farmers and fruit growers bring in the harvest here in the UK. At the same time "Concordia" Brighton based volunteer/employ ee charity recorded that while 35.000 participants had expressed an interest in farming work only 5,500 had taken up the offer of an interview. Part of the issue matching up skills along with other factors such as length of contracts accommodation.

Brexit and Covid 19 have compounded the issues especially as it is harder to recruit overseas workers. I suspect also that when a lot of people looked at what was required enthusiasm waned somewhat. Agricultural work of any kind is hardly a glamorous affair. The work can be back breaking. You have to be out in all kinds of weathers and up at all kinds of times. You literally work "by the sweat of

your brow." Yet it is work that literally brings life. The farmers plants the crops, then he/she harvests them and food arrives on the table. If you are a vine grower your work brings wine to the table which a wine lover like me really appreciates. 'Yet if the shortage of workers continues the harvest could be left in the ground and the food would not arrive.

Jesus also talks about a harvest that is short of workers. He says, "the harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest therefore to send workers into the harvest" (Matt 9'.37-38). He is talking about a quite different harvest. A harvest of souls whose hunger is for eternal life rather than just earthly life. The previous verse describes the crowds that Jesus addressed as being 'harassed helpless, and

sheep without a shepherd". What an apt description of people in our country today. Covid 19, climate change, "black

lives matter", ageing, loneliness are all issues that frighten us and leave us feeling stressed. Depression is the second biggest disease in the UK after heart disease.

As Christians, Jesus calls us to be harvest workers, bringing his message of hope to our world. A message of love, forgiveness, reconciliation and mercy, but like the physical harvest it is hard work. The gospel message calls people to repentance and turning away from self, back to God. Not everyone wants to hear that. Often we will be

rejected or even jeered at. The media will gleefully tell us that church is dead, showing statistics to prove it. We, however, need to quietly persist. Offering the love of Christ in word and deed. Gently sharing his message of grace and mercy. There are hungry souls out there. We need to go and find then. Also one day the harvest will be brought in and then we will see the fruit of our work. Jesus promises a return of up to 100 fold on our harvesting (Mathew 13:23).

That is a return worth breaking our back for.

THAXTED FESTIVAL

It was an emotional moment when I was able to introduce our opening concert on Thursday 24 June. Months of planning in an environment uncertain had preoccupied all of our team. Would our audiences feel safe to return? Would our artists be able to perform? Would the regulations change at the last moment? What would the course of the pandemic be by June? In the end, the applause which greeted the opening of our new season said it all: yes, our audiences were overwhelmed to be back to hear live music, and our musicians were delighted to be performing on stage again, many of them for the first time in 18 months.

Thaxted Festival's usual mix of classical, vocal, orchestral, and chamber music, infused with jazz and other offerings, again formed our programme this year. But having to present our concerts with safely distanced seating and performance areas meant that we had to re-think all our planning. With reduced audience numbers and smaller-scale ensembles we were able to keep our finances in

balance. Happily, Thaxted Parish Church offers such a splendid space that we were able to adapt suit current easilv to the conditions; something other venues had more difficulty with. We compressed our season into two long weekends rather than the usual four weekends, and we were delighted that our audiences returned in such significant numbers, with many concerts full to our reduced capacity.

Until near to our opening, we had hoped to be able to offer our usual caterina, interval with renowned home-made cakes and liquid refreshments. Unfortunately, government regulations were not relaxed in time and we missed out on this social element of our season. However, it was a small price to pay for the overall enthusiasm and delight of our audiences and artists at getting back to live performances. The standard of performance throughout this year was second to none, and we feel we have enhanced Thaxted's reputation as a festival where you can be sure to enjoy the highest musical standards across all our events.

So, what have we learned from these difficult times? Above all. we've been assured of the great support from our audiences who want to hear live music in our surroundings. superb Our volunteer teams have come up with new and creative solutions for how we do things - from ticketing through to staging and managing everyone's safety. With almost everyone now accustomed to supporting their lives online, we have been able to extend our reach in promotion and ticketing, and our profile across the music profession, through social media, emails and our online ticketing. Our new design, created by Vrve Thaxted, has aiven strength to our website and our overall 'brand', while conveying what is unique about our Festival. We've learned to do some things differently, and we will continue to innovate in future seasons.

There are many people to thank for bringing us successfully through the past year and a half. Our volunteers have worked hard in front of and behind the scenes, and the Festival Board has worked thoughtfully and meticulously to oversee all our planning. The Vicar, Church-wardens and congregation of the Church have

been understanding and accommodating. Thaxted United Reformed Church were able to offer spacious 'green room' facilities for our artists to prepare and refresh themselves. We have benefitted greatly from support of our Thaxted Music Lovers through their annual subscriptions, and also from their many messages of support and appreciation. Our 'TMLs' are part of our close Festival family, and receive benefits including priority booking periods and special events, from as little as £15 per year. Details are on our website, and new subscriptions will be available for our 2022 season from the beginning of next year.

Thaxted Festival now continues throughout the year, as well as during our summer seasons. Don't miss our autumn recital, with star young pianist lyad Sughayer, in Thaxted Church at 3.00pm on Sunday 17 October. Tickets for this



are already on sale to Thaxted Music Lovers, and will be on general sale from Monday 6 September at 9.30 through our website, priced at £17 each. In early 2022 we will have a preview event for Thaxted Music Lovers for our summer season, which will be back to our regular format of four weekends, Friday through Sunday, between 17 June and 10 July.

UPDATE FROM THE THAXTED FAYRE TRUST

Bringing the community together through fundraising

Well, what a challenging 18 months this has been for all of us! The Thaxted Fayre Trust, like so many businesses and charities had to lock-down and cease all events. And being as this is our only source of fundraising, we've had no alternative but to put our Community Grant Scheme on hold. But times are slowly changing, and light does appear to be starting to shine brighter at the end of the tunnel.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

So, with everything crossed, we are hoping to bring our town together next June to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 when Her Majesty was 25 years old. An extended bank holiday, from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the

historic milestone. The four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on The Queen's 70 years of service.

How would you like to celebrate the event?

We, in collaboration with Thaxted Parish Council and Thaxted Live are meeting in early September to start planning on

The Trust operates as a not-for-profit Organisation with the stated purpose of community development and relieving poverty. We know that those living in low or modest incomes in rural communities face real difficulties when trying to find a home in their own town/village and we want to help by providing *local homes for local people*. As a Trust we want to ensure:

- fairer access to stable and secure housing that enables well-being and is genuinely affordable and protected in perpetuity
- a variety of housing tenures which reflect the multiple housing needs of our community, enabling residents to continue living and/or working in Thaxted should they wish to do so
