The liturgical calendar is currently taking the church through the drama of Lent, Holy Week and Easter. Christians are bidden to use Lent as a way to prepare for the celebration of Christ's resurrection at Easter. Our lives are preoccupied by so many things; so even if we have failed to notice Lent very much, Holy Week and the observation of the ceremonies of Palm Sunday. Maundv Thursday and Good Friday, will bring us face to face with the dark realities of human brokenness as at the same time we renew our confidence in the transformative light of Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

Christians seek to proclaim that Christ's life is available to us every day; nevertheless it is during Lent, Holy Week and Easter, that the church revisits the story of how it was that God renewed his promise of life through Jesus Christ, and how it is that he invites us in every generation to share in his victory over death. Lent and Holy Week revisits this mysterious drama since there is a power in the telling of that story; it has an ability to stir something deep within us - a spiritual awakening that forces us to confront this

In the previous few magazines, I've been trying to keep you up to date with progress on Uttlesford District Council's (UDC) Local Plan. UDC published the draft plan under 'Regulation 18' which gave us all a chance to comment and request amendments.

The Parish Council, would like to share their full response in advance of the next stage called 'Regulation 19' where again, we will be able to comment and make representation before the plan goes for examination by planning inspectors.

We hoped to include it in this edition of the magazine. HOWEVER, it is very large and it would have taken up an unreasonable amount of pages. Therefore it has been turned into the booklet distributed with this magazine. A basic summary of the response is on the opposite page.

This response has been endorsed by the District Councillors, Cllrs Martin Foley, Richard Haynes and Mike Tayler. We hope our response reflects the views of the many people and organisations to whom we spoke. We would like to thank you all for your input and to thank Cllr Nick Weakley for his time and perseverance in producing the document.

CHRISTMAS RAFFLE

The raffle brought in £2050. This is going towards Blood Pressure machines for home monitoring and equipping admin rooms for future clinical use.

Subject headings of the TPC's Response

Sustainability The DLP justifiably recognises Thaxted as less sustainable than other key settlements within Uttlesford.

Transport Infrastructure The assumption is that a significant number of additional cars will be required to get people to work, school, shops recreation, in an already recognised un-sustainable environment.

Housing Thaxted has significantly contributed over the years to the increase in housing within the District.

Education The DLP proposes a new (replacement) Primary School on the site off Sampford Road.

Landscape and Heritage TPC note that a major policy from the 2005 plan has been omitted and not adequately replaced by a suitable equivalent.

Services The DLP, with its proposal of a major influx of housing makes no reference for any additional services.

Economy TPC note that the DLP identifies no proposals for developing the Thaxted economy.

Flood Risk Thaxted has a documented history of flood events.

Neighbourhood Plan TPC have referenced within the Landscape and Heritage Section how the detailed information and justification for Thaxted's neighbourhood Plan has not been included.

Proposals TPC list a series of proposals which we believe could help mitigate the concerns raised within our response and assist in suitable drafting of the DLP to meet its intended aims.

Thaxted - NEWS - Society

At the Society so much of what we do and sometimes achieve is entirely due to two fundamentals: first, the best outcome for everyone, and second, the volunteers who work tirelessly to make *that* happen.

Often what goes on at meetings is considered non-action, but that is not the case. Discussion and strategy important in are preparing for any action going forward. Much of what affects our lives is both discussed and decided. very often without our input, and even when we are asked to contribute, we may be left with the unerring sense of 'what was the point'? Were we heard?

Well, here is the point! The accumulative effect of our participation and contributions. Month by month and year after responses repeated vear. to consultations and inclusion build a robust picture of an engaged community. At The Thaxted Society we have evidence, based upon responses and our engagement on behalf of Thaxted. The more engaged we have become the more our voice is heard.

Over the years Thaxted Society have developed respected positions and policies. It took the dedicated work of volunteers, to publish the Thaxted Design Statement in 2010, (the precursor to the Thaxted Neighbourhood Plan), and in 2016 the Thaxted Building Design Guide, republished in 2023. They all have had an impact. You can read them here: thaxtedsociety.com

That impact may be little more than a pause for thought, or a simple reference to the document or policy, but, once that has happened then planners and developers alike cannot avoid seeing that we mean business. Noting that Thaxted cares and expects *that care in return*.

Whilst our oasis of calm may be treasured, we must not forget the bigger picture. Being cut off by snow is less likely than in the 1960's but being out of step, cut off from what goes on beyond the Parish remains a risk that may increasingly impact our quiet oasis.

Remember that Uttlesford is almost 90% rural and unbuilt. Without strategy and action, we are always at risk, after all, who wouldn't want to live in Thaxted?

Changes National to the Planning Policy Framework **NPPF** suggest some hope for Thaxted. One change is to consider 'out of character' developments that harm the local character of a place. Another makes clear that low grade farmland should be preferred to high grade food producing land when considering development.

Recent planning applications, whilst small scope. in are nevertheless robustly scrutinised by the Society, as well as the Parish Council, particularly where they are within the conservation area. Altering a listed building is a delicate balance and onlv realistically possible where care has been taken with the building's, history. its narrative. and location.

June 6th will see the AGM of the Society, our sixty first Annual General Meeting, which this year includes a special guest speaker. We hope you will mark your calendar. Further details will be announced online and posted.

MIKE MCCOOK WEIR 1932 - 2024 A personal tribute by Caroline Mccookweir

My father died at home in Thaxted on the 17th December 2023.

He was born on 4th June 1932 in St. Saviour, Jersey one of four boys. Most of Mike's childhood was spent on a farm near Sudbury in Suffolk called Eyston Lodge. It still exists

and is remarkably unchanged. The boys walked the 4 miles to school in Foxearth. except when they had the use of a bicvcle for part of the way. This contraption had no saddle, no brakes and no tyres and 3 of them rode it at the same

time. They called it "the Ram" and it could be heard coming for miles.

Henry had hoped Mike would take up farming, but Dad had set his sights, literally higher. He wanted to be a pilot. Nonetheless he completed a year at Writtle Agricultural College to please his father, then he joined the Navy to learn how to fly. His training took place partly in Florida and also in Lossiemouth in Scotland, and at some point during this time he met my mother Mary at a Fleet Air Arm Function. He used to tell the story of "borrowing" a jet to fly from Scotland to the South to meet up

with Mum. They married in 1956. Unfortunately due to Mike being called to sea because of the Suez Crisis, my mother spent her honeymoon with her mother, Dora.

Mike spent 12 years in the Navy, flying fighter jets, particularly Sea

Vixens, from Aircraft Carriers. He saw service from the Mediterranean to the Far East, and developed formidable skills as a pilot, as well as the ability to be able sleep through to anything. When he left Navy, the he flew

commercially for B.O.A.C., Aer Lingus, British Eagle, and Cathay Pacific. The family all moved from England to Ireland to Wales and then Hong Kong. Dad flew in and out of the infamous Kai Tak Airport for nearly 20 years. When Dad retired from flying, he and Mary moved to Seattle, where Dad worked taking delivery of Boeing Jets for Cathay.

They finally retired to Blandford in Dorset, then Lichfield before moving to Thaxted in 2003. Tragically, in July 2004, my mother, who had long battled with appalling depression, took



her own life. Part of my father's coping strategy was to start going to church. There he met Patricia. They married in 2005 and had a very happy 15 years together. Both were Gemini. both inveterate travellers and they must have circumnavigated the globe manv times on their numerous cruises. During this time Mike was also active as a volunteer in many different organisations. including Rotary, Probus and the Parochial Church Council.

In his eighties, Mike's memory started to decline and eventually he was diagnosed with Dementia. He lost his only son, Michael, himself a pilot in 2016 to lung cancer, which didn't help his mental state. That said, he retained his humour, scrabble skills and long term memory to the end. shall remember his patience, generosity, kindness, sense of duty and daft sense of humour.

LORD MAYNARD'S CHARITY

In his will, dated 30th May 1698, the Rt. Hon. William, Lord Maynard allocated £4000 for his executors to use for several purposes including helping the people of Thaxted, in particular families with young children and apprentices, which today includes students.

The charity is in the care of five Trustees and is administered by the Trustees together with the Vicar and Churchwardens of Thaxted, and the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of Thaxted Parish Council.

Applications are invited from eligible **residents of Thaxted** to benefit from the charity that fall into one of the following categories:

- 1. Families with three or more children under the age of 16 on the qualifying date 31st August 2024. Please give the names and dates of birth of the qualifying children.
- 2. Couples one or both being resident in Thaxted who were married in Thaxted Parish Church within the previous twelve months of the qualifying date 31st August 2024. Please give the date of the marriage.
- 3. Students undertaking further education. This excludes sixth form colleges. Please give the name of the course and of the college or university. Please note only one application can be made.
- 4. Apprentices. Please give the name of the company to whom the applicant is apprenticed. Please note that only one application can be made.

Distribution of grants depends on the funds available and the number of applications received. Applications should be sent to Daniel Fox, Moulton, Vicarage Lane, Thaxted CM6 2QP or email to thaxtedfox@gmail.com to arrive by 31st July 2024. They will be reviewed at a meeting of the Trustees and Administrators to be held in September 2024.

John Webb's Windmill – An Update





The Development Phase of the project 'Thaxted Windmill -Conserved for its Community' is being helped by a group of dedicated and enthusiastic volunteers. Some were recruited through Facebook; others through articles in the Press; by attendance at the Thaxted Community Fair or by individual contacts.

So that the Windmill could be fully assessed for repair, the artefacts which have been displayed in the building for many years needed to be removed and placed in safe storage. This was done on 23 and 24 November 2023 by sixteen volunteers who gave 90.5 hours to the task. Four members of Saffron Walden Camera Club generously attended to make a visual record of the work.

On Saturday 13 January 2024, seventeen people came to learn about the opportunities for volunteering until June of this year, when the Development Phase ends. Anne Mason, Project Manager, gave a presentation about the project, explaining the structural and Millwrighting machinery work needed to conserve the Windmill and then describing the tasks that volunteers could undertake to gather vital information which will help in planning the Delivery Phase. As a result, working Mills are being visited to assess the feasibility of Thaxted Windmill's producing flour; a Resources Directory is being compiled, listing the archives which relate to the Windmill; research is underway to find Mills in other parts of the world undergoing restoration, to compare knowledge, expertise and experiences and to set up a web-based Mills community; in addition, educational providers are being consulted about learning materials.

A consultation evening on Friday 9 February, held in the Church Hall, Margaret Street, was attended by forty-seven people, evidence of the interest there is in the Windmill. They heard about the plans for the structural repairs from Ed Morton, Managing Director of The Morton Partnership and the Lead Consultant to the project. He also described the work needed to the sails and Millwrighting machinery, on behalf of Luke Bonwick, Consultant Millwright. Trudi Hughes, Historic England's Heritage at Risk Surveyor spoke about the importance of promoting the conservation of heritage buildings and Millwrighting as careers for young people.

Anne Mason, Project Manager, gave an overview of the work currently being undertaken for access, interpretation, learning materials and the care of the artefacts. She also talked about the opportunities for day schools, workshops, family and other events which need to be planned now and then included in the submission to The National Lottery Heritage Fund in June for funding for the Delivery Phase. There will also be a further application for funding to Historic England.

To help ensure that the activities will appeal to the widest range of people and increase interest in the Windmill, those attending completed a consultation form. This form is also available as a paper copy at the Community Centre / Library or it can be requested by emailing johnwebbswindmill@gmail.com.

Mark Rickards, Secretary to Thaxted Windmill Trust CIO, who led the consultation evening, was delighted at the range of organisations who attended and would like to extend the thanks of the Trustees for the support demonstrated by the community.

ISN'T IT TIME TO LET GO? Jim Ford

About ten years ago in Scotland I had the most remarkable conversation for all the wrong reasons. It. was а cold winter's morning and I was standing at the entrance of the care home where my mother was living.



Conscious of a presence I turned and engaged in conversation with the man behind me. Indulging in that well-loved British topic "the weather," I happened to say that it was even colder in England. To which my fellow Scot remarked, "I don't care about the English. They beat us at Culloden. Just to put this statement in context, the previously mentioned "Culloden" was a battle fought in April 1746. "patriotic" friend Μv was obviously unaware that the Scots actually fought on both sides as it was less a Scottish/English battle and more a Protestant/Catholic conflict. Known as "the 45" it was the last attempt of the Catholic Stuarts to wrestle the throne from the Protestant Hanoverians. Τo my amazement the same conflict generated another explosion of feeling in Scotland this week. Edinburgh Castle has just reopened its cafe and named it "The Cafe." It Redcoat was Redcoats who fought on the Hanoverian side at Culloden and garrisoned Scotland in 1746. Once again feelings are running high over a close to

300-year-old battle. Resentments run very deep.

As I reflected on this guite bizarre state of affairs my thoughts turned to two incidents at the where Jesus offers cross Both are found in forgiveness. Luke's gospel. In the first incident the crowd, including the religious leaders are mocking Jesus for his apparent helplessness. Instead of anger Jesus responds with a prayer to his Father in Heaven: "Forgive them Father for they don't know what they are doing." In the face of hatred and mockery he responds with forgiveness. Far from being angry he is full of compassion for his enemies. The incident second involves а convicted thief hanging next to him who pleads, "Jesus remember me when you come in to your kingdom." A man with no hope of making amends cries to Jesus for mercy and amazingly he responds with "I tell you, this very day you will be with me in Paradise."

National and personal resentments destrov lives. Whether it is Israeli and Palestinian in Gaza, Catholic and Protestant in Northern Ireland, Hutu and Tutsi in Rwanda or Harry and William the refusal to forgive tears people apart. Yet a key message of Easter is surely that forgiveness mends. A preacher once said that it was no accident that Jesus was a carpenter. Carpenters mend things that are broken. Jesus's death on the cross mended the relationship between humanity and God. For those who believe, the pathway to God is opened up through Jesus and human beings can come home. Christ's forgiveness of us allows us in turn to forgive others. The terrible burden of hatred and resentment can be lifted.

Perhaps if I spoke to that man again, I would say to him, "Isn't it time to let go"?

SHEILAH RENGERT A personal tribute by Sybil King

Sheilah was a registered nurse right up to the day she died! Sybil met her in 1964 at that time when she was expecting her first baby. In those days, such matters were not discussed openly as they are now and a certain amount of mystery surrounded the whole proceedings. Late I opened my door, there in full uniform. stood this wonderful Health Visitor. Sheilah. She was kind. efficient, chatty and, the over weeks. particularly helpful in the matter caring for a new baby. Later, Sheilah came to me

and said "Sybil, I need some advice now! What's it really like?!!"

Sheilah was born in Norfolk on 9th June 1936. During the second World War, the whole family moved to Talybont in North Wales. The little girls went to Infant School there and learned the Welsh language. They thoroughly enjoyed being able to make comments which their parents could not understand!!

After the war, Sheilah's father became a manager at Heinz Foods. He maintained that no soup could compare with Heinz Tomato Soup, even when home made from freshly grown tomatoes, it was never as good as Heinz!

Sheilah needed an operation on her eyes and was fascinated by the care taken by the nurses. This was the inspiration for her future life and career!

Sheilah qualified as a Nurse in Norwich Hospital, then as a

Midwife in St Thomas Hospital, London and as a Health Visitor at Southampton.

Sheilah met Chris at a meeting both were reluctant to attend. A fortnight later came a first

date. Not long after they were married in September 1963 so reaching their Diamond Wedding in 2023!

They moved to a bungalow in Thaxted and continued their careers, Sheilah becoming a Health Visitor for the Elderly, attached to Addenbrookes. She played a significant role in the introduction of a scheme to relieve the pressure on Carers, and to improve the level of provision of hospital facilities.

Sheilah was a Lay member for various committees at the Royal College of Physicians, a member of the Health Ministry Clinical Standards Advisory Body and an active member of the Committee of the British Nursing Association. After retirement she became legal adviser, offering litigation advice to the Court in cases of elderly health care.

Her main interest at home was her garden. Being generous hosts and good cooks, Sheilah and Chris held many very jolly Christmas parties, both for friends and for more fundraising events. Chris became involved with the restoration of the Lincoln Organ so Sheilah gave full support to all the fund-raising events held for that. We thank her for all her compassion and loving care. So much passion to make a difference to people, is so evident

from this short piece. The memory of this dedicated health professional will last for a long time.

HOLST IN THAXTED – A CONDITION OF ETERNITY

For those of us who live in Thaxted, it may be unremarkable that composer Gustav Holst lived among us from 1913 to 1925. I sing in local amateur choir Granta Chorale (https://www.grantachorale.org.uk/) and, in researching a concert to celebrate Holst's 150th anniversary year in 2024, it has surprised me what a remarkable period of war, revolution, art and religion this time was. I hope fellow Thaxted residents can join us at our celebration concert at 4pm on Sunday 28 April in Thaxted Church and experience something of Gustav Holst's musical life in Thaxted.

Our concert features his compositions, music that inspired him, and music inspired by him. We trace Holst's arrival in Thaxted, his founding of the Whitsun Festival and his later life. From his inaugural Festival programme we sing Bach's Kyrie in A, along with Kyries by his great friend Vaughan Williams, and by his daughter Imogen. Organist Richard Carr plays the Jig from the St Paul's Suite on the Lincoln organ which Holst himself played, and we sing Holst's Nunc Dimittis, folksong arrangements and festival Choruses. Janet Wheeler's Ceaseless Round of Circling Planets, written for the centenary of the Planets Suite, uses solo waterphone to create otherworldly sounds. Between the varied music we hear words from Holst and his contemporaries that evoke the extraordinary time of England in the 1910s.

Holst said of choral singing in Thaxted, "Music - being identical with heaven - isn't a thing of momentary thrills, or even hourly ones. It's a condition of eternity." Join Granta Chorale on 28 April to share that experience of eternity in our glorious church.

It started like any other Wednesday morning in early Spring with mass in church at 10am. I engaged briefly, thereafter, with some visitors who were asking about filming in and around the church. Having introduced them to a Church Warden, who could give them accurate information, I retreated down Stoney Lane to continue with the business of my day.

No sooner had I brewed coffee, than someone knocked on my door. I later learned that 'they' had been at various doors and had been met with varying degrees of enthusiasm. I suspect that the slightly comical display of teddy bears in my large bay window sparked interest. Perhaps I would be a slightly eccentric resident who would engage with their ideas.

My outlook on life is to say yes to most new experiences if they intrigue me. Living in a little cobbled street in a small rural town in Essex, this was an opportunity I had not expected to come my way. I was being invited to participate in a film to be shot mainly in Thaxted. Even without a clear idea of the storyline, I was fascinated to be part of the process.

Marc the Director and Adam the Script Writer had conversations with me to explain the process in more detail. It transpired that they teach young people the craft of film making and several of their advanced students would form part of the team. They handled sound and lighting, scene setting and props. One of them, delightful Lori, was the real star of the show. This young Chinese girl would be filming within the film; an absorbing technique for revealing parts of the story. As a group of differing nationalities, they worked together wonderfully as a team. They were helpful, courteous, respectful of my belongings and fun.

After the initial briefings, all went silent, and I began to wonder whether 'they' had had second thoughts about me. Suddenly a message would indicate everything was springing into life. The gang would pile into my little house with lights, boom, cameras and more. Before I knew it, my room would be transformed into 'the set'. If I had been panicking about learning lines or wardrobe, hair or make up I need not have worried. It was a matter of wearing my own clothes, styling my own hair, and making up as normal. Occasionally a photo would ping up on my phone showing a particular outfit I had worn, with a request to wear the same again. I almost gave Marc a heart attack part way through filming by announcing that I was off to Edinburgh to visit my tame hairdresser for my annual haircut. He prevailed upon me to delay this.

There was no written script to learn. For each scene Marc would give me the main thread of what was happening and the gist of what he wanted me to say. I then had to speak in my own voice, using my own language, to bring out the sense of the story. If I failed to achieve sufficient authenticity, then we would do it again. For much of the filming. Marc shot the characters at very close range. Nowhere to hide. Each conversation took place twice over. He would focus the camera on one of us at a time. Part of his skill lay in editing the material, so it flowed in conversations. Sadly, I did not have the opportunity to review the scenes during the process. This meant that, the completed film, did not always come across exactly as I would have liked either in speech or facial expression. I must simply remind myself that I am a part of the process, playing a character the director has imagined. The success or otherwise of this will lie with whether I portray the landlady to Lori in the way he has envisaged for the purposes of this story and whether the traits and eccentricities I display through the character are convincing in context.

Some scenes were filmed in church when I was in my server's outfit carrying the crucifix. I didn't even realise these had been filmed. At least in church it was cool which is more than can be said for the churchyard. The summer of 2022 saw some fiercely hot days and filming in the heat of the day was less than comfortable. We worked one day around a fake but realistic grave which was created, with permission, to fulfil the requirements of the film. At the end of the day's filming, this fabrication was removed and left no visible trace.

A couple of scenes were filmed at the grave of Jim, my late husband. Initially I felt unsure about participating in this. Yet it was somehow comforting to be including him in a story set in the place he loved so much. I have lived here since 1993 and have developed a lively interest in Morris Weekend which was one of the highlights of Jim's calendar. I was sensitive to respecting the space



and complying with the etiquette of the weekend. Local people should have as good a view as possible and all must stay clear of the main street during the dancing. The filmmakers, with their compulsion to document, had to have their enthusiasm curbed at times. At one stage, I simply refused to push forward. Occasionally I did check they had permission to film if I felt this might be in doubt. Mostly they respected boundaries and conformed to the spirit of the weekend. One special and unexpected moment captured the toast I drink to Jim with his friends on the arrival night.

As the months passed, I looked forward to their whirlwind visits in which my room was transformed for a scene with good humour and attention to detail. Within a couple of hours filming would be complete and the room reinstated. I enjoyed the company and the activity and missed the little gang when the job was done. I have maintained a friendship with Lori the Chinese girl whose company I particularly enjoyed.

After filming was complete, signified by my receiving permission to have my hair cut, I was left initially in limbo. I had no idea how much of what had been filmed would appear in the finished piece of work. Just because of the way the film was created, I could not really figure out how it hung together as a story. The scenes were not filmed sequentially, and some, in which I was not involved, were filmed elsewhere. Finally, This Blessed Plot was released, has been to festivals in Amsterdam and Germany and is starting to be shown in small cinemas in and around London.

Marc brought the finished disk to me late last year and I had a first viewing, though not on a cinema-sized screen. That opportunity was mine about a fortnight ago in London. Seeing it on a full screen is a very different experience. I was surprised by how many of the scenes in which I appeared had been retained. Watching it stirred up such a cocktail of emotions from surprise, sadness and joy to relief, embarrassment, and pride too in something achieved.

I have deliberately avoided telling you the story of the film. It took me considerably by surprise, even though I had been participating in chunks of it. Yet when I did watch it, all came together beautifully and made so much sense. It is interesting, quirky, moving, and funny. If you don't believe me, form your own impression when it is screened on Sunday March 24 at 7.30pm at Saffron Screen followed by a Q & A session with Marc and Adam.
