

Hello,

I'm very new here, but I love you. Love one another was Jesus' very clear instruction, so don't be surprised or alarmed! I am your new parish priest. Returning to live in beautiful North West Essex has been a lovely thing, isn't it a good place! On the 7th July Bishop Guli, our Chelmsford Diocesan bishop, gave me the license to minister (gave me the *Cure of Souls*) in the beautiful benefice of Thaxted, the Sampfords,



Radwinter and Hempstead. It was a wonderful evening service in Thaxted Parish Church. For me, the best thing was that the next morning I woke up and immediately felt like the words, the previous evening, had done their work; I knew I was in the right place, that I felt rooted, at home, and the Anglican priest for this place, for these places, and for you.

In church and out, I am hoping you'll get to know me as I get to know you. Now, it's the day of the deadline for this magazine and I am at home after service of Thanksgiving St Michael's. Marriage in Sampford. A lovely couple married in the church last year, came with their family and friends to ask for a blessing and to celebrate all the good things about their married life. This was wonderful, and the church is here for life's events. Talk to me about your life, and about life! There are many things to do, always, but never think I am too busy for you. I am here only for you, and God! Stop, and say hello to me, I do hope you will. Now, I am looking out at the fields opposite the vicarage, the other side of the Chelmer Valley. Some of those fields are harvested and some not yet, and it is raining. I love living surrounded by farmland and have

done so for most of my life. For the bread I've just toasted (a very late breakfast after that service in Gt Sampford), the Essex jam I put on it, the milk in the tea I've just drank (and the tea harvested in other places) I am truly thankful and in awe of the farmers. I am looking at those fields and can see that there is so much work! As I drink the tea, I am thanking God for all he gives us, and all we can offer back to him in thankfulness. I am saying a prayer for all who are bringing in the harvest, and I am thinking about the

news, the tragic and ongoing news suffering those devastating and who are deprivations. desperate need of food. suffering, the starvation, in Gaza is in every way unconscionable. Come into the church to pray for those who will die this day from starvation in Gaza. Our churches are very good places; steeped in centuries of prayer and devotion from so many who have offered up to God their hope, their celebrations, their anguish, their love, their joy, their all, that God sees as the abundant life he gives.

God has blessed us, but still we see inequality and oppression in the earth. Lord, have mercy.

Thaxted - NEWS - Society

THE 'GUILDHALL' BUILT 1460-70

This is how we know it today but, in its past, it may have been known by other names and for other purposes. There is no doubt that it was built for the town and has continually been used for the town's benefit to this day. The Society is committed to ensuring the Guildhall's central purpose in Thaxted's life and while that purpose may change, standing where it does means that its importance is undeniable. It remains one of the earliest examples of a 'market hall', along with others one of which stood in Titchfield and is now part of The Weald & Downland Museum.

TOWN MARKET

Given a smaller population the Guildhall was ample as a market. It was likely that this was regular with market folk coming to trade in poultry, cheese and butter. Without refrigeration or even easily available ice, food bought on the day was for consumption or preserving on that day. The market was held twice a week and there were two fairs a year, which seem to have been held in Town Street from the 15th Century.

BOROUGH COUNCIL CHAMBER

Thaxted's status as Manor, Parish, and Borough has waxed and waned over the centuries but there is ample evidence that the original meeting room for such bodies was the top floor, while the first floor remained unglazed and open to the elements during the day, with heavy shutters in place at night. Latterly, post glazing and the addition of Georgian

panelling and a fireplace, the first floor was used for meetings of the 'current authority' and is used for the Parish Council meetings today.

THAXTED'S 1ST SCHOOL ROOM and POST-WAR SCHOOLROOM

The Guildhall has been a school room twice, most recently during the last war when the first floor was a temporary school room for evacuee children from Leyton, under the tutelage of Kate Butters and much earlier courtesy of Yardley's Charity who paid for some repairs to the building while establishing a schoolroom for Thaxted on the top floor. Boys would be taught from 8 years to 14 years.

COURT ROOM

What court there was in Thaxted, was the aptly named 'quarrels hall', but it was far too small and badly located. (It still exists as part of Market Cross House.) A new building was required which would meet the needs and save costs. This was to become the Guildhall. The upper floor held the court of the market on market and fair days. The courts of the Manor, and Borough, held their meetings there, as did the Cutlers Guild and Yardley's charity. Today it houses the Thaxted archive alongside the Thaxted Morris exhibition.

LOCK UP

The lock up, accessible from both inside and out was, as its name implies a temporary place for any unfortunate, drunk, vagrant, and the like who would be put here awaiting going before a 'magistrate' in one form or another. A deterrent, by example, for bad behaviour. Given the enormous value and power of the Manor justice was swift and uncompromising.



FUTURAM EXCITANS

As for a future for such an iconic and valuable community building? The answers are as complex as the history, and maybe that is why its

future is complex also. Access to such an old building is notoriously difficult and for a building to be useful in a community today sensitive access solutions are essential. A balance must be struck between conservation and regular use. Equally for the visitor, attracted by Thaxted's charms and its history, having such an interesting building open and accessible is essential. Thaxted's Guildhall presents great promise from the outside and that promise should be fulfilled by its interiors, showing how it has been used and for what all through its history. A review of timber used in the construction of the Guildhall, 'tree ring dating', shows that the trees that made up these timbers were felled between 1428 and 1453. However green oak was never used in construction, so, a date range for the Guildhall's construction is between 1460-70. There was a commercial plantation of ancient oaks near Bardfield End Green. Weathered oak was stored there and widely used for important buildings in the area, most notably a number of the Cambridge colleges. This was the most likely source of the Guildhall's timbers. The fact they remain upright and warm to the touch after some 555 years is astonishing.



Anglia Ruskin University recently undertook research as to the role such buildings play in today's communities. Much of that work centred on Thaxted's Guildhall. Research will be published later this year and this will add to sum of our understanding of both history and purpose. Alterations and repairs over the years, have, in some instances,

clouded its story which is also the story of Thaxted. It would be exciting to reveal the true bones of both building and its extraordinary story.

In mid-2026 the Guildhall's future will be part of a wide-ranging review of such assets throughout Essex. Your Society will be spearheading a campaign to not only secure the Guildhall's future as a community asset in public ownership, but to ensure that, like the Windmill, it may be restored and rejuvenated long term, on a sound basis, enabling it to continue to play its part in the vibrant community that is, Thaxted! (an exciting future)

Like many of their contemporaries the people of Israel were dependent on good harvests to survive. It is no surprise therefore to learn that their three great annual festivals were at least in part

a celebration of a good harvest.

The first harvest was the barley harvest which took place in the Spring and the



festival was known as "Firstfruits." More importantly it was linked to Passover when the Israelites remembered that God delivered them from slavery in Egypt.

The second harvest was the grain harvest took place approximately seven weeks later. The festival that celebrated it was known as the "Feast of Weeks or Pentecost". The Christian church has of course adopted these two festivals for its own purposes. Passover has become Easter when we remember the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Pentecost is now celebrated as the birth of the church when the Holy Spirit came

down on the first disciples and empowered them for mission.

Yet there is one more great festival which the Jews celebrated and that was known as the "Feast of Tabernacles." It took place around September/October and celebrated the gathering in of all the crops. It was a seven-day party where the people ate, drank, and thanked God for the harvest. Unlike us they had no technology to protect them and so the success of the harvest was literally life or death. They also spent the week living in tents rather than in their houses. That was to remind them of their deliverance from Egypt and



God's protection of them when they lived in the desert for 40 years. In other words it was a reminder of their utter dependence

on God. We may think we rely on Waitrose or Sainsburys for our food, but they in turn rely on farmers to produce and the farmers in turn rely on the weather. Guess who controls the weather? God is still Lord of the Harvest.

There is one interesting thing about tabernacles. Unlike Passover and Pentecost it has not yet found a Christian fulfilment. As the Jews gathered in the harvest during Tabernacles so God will gather in his people at the end of time. Jesus will return one day and as the New Testament tells us he will gather all those people who belong to him together. All those who follow Jesus will celebrate on

that day. Jesus made a very poignant statement to Jerusalem in connection with this while he was on earth. A statement that still applies to many people today. "Oh Jerusalem, Jerusalem how often have I longed to gather your children like a hen gathers her chickens under her wings, but you would not let me." The key question for each one of us is, "Will I come under Jesus's wing or will I stay outside? Will I be at the party on the last day or will I stay away?"

am, where a member of our team will help you find the right place in the display.


Visit on the day

Humanitarian Aid - Bread

What would I do if given a sack of flour to feed my family to prevent them from starving to death? I have no idea at all. A sack of flour but nothing else. No yeast, no oil, meat , vegetables, tomato puree, only a small amount of water; no kitchen, no cooking utensils, no roof over my head to protect me from the elements. Whatever would I do? Of course, it is inconceivable this would happen here in the UK - total devastation of our Country or community.

I lived abroad in North Africa for many years where there was a plethora of fruit, vegetables, fish, meat, olive oil, tomato paste, pasta and potable water was on tap. The majority of people had comfortable, However, during modern homes. one period after а political revolution, it was difficult to find meat within city butchers and one had to seek supplies in rural areas where large flocks of sheep were kept by local farmers. Moreover, supermarket and grocery shops ran out of imported foodstuffs although the local pasta factory kept up their supplies. Sugar and flour was sold through the government by

sackload for each family but I did not want to keep sacks of these to attract weevils and ants. Therefore family relatives with larger families would call by my home with bowls of flour and sugar by the kilo.

Local women would make cakes at home using flour, sugar, honey and nuts and these would be taken on large, round aluminium trays to be baked by their nearest bakery. Noone starved during this transition Throughout North Africa period. and the Mediterranean generally copious amounts of bread are eaten daily with both lunch and dinner. Family members go to the bakers to buy long, baguette-style loaves to accompany main dishes, salads and side dishes, i.e. dolmas, koftas and Occasionally I would see salads. Arab women making their own bread similar to Indian fluffy paratha - small dough balls flattened by hand until they are almost transparent and then cooked over a high heat with a little oil.

To live amongst rubble after losing your home with all its comforts and facilities is something we find it hard to envisage in our own lives yet wars in the Ukraine, the Middle East and

East Africa leave millions destitute without the means to overcome their situation. Although we seasonal flooding and fires in America and Europe which have resulted in many people experiencing homelessness, in our societies we can expect to receive from aid Government some

agencies, charities and insurance to help those people to rehabilitate. Hopefully, no-one should starve.

Again, what if I was in a situation where all I was able to obtain, at the risk of my life, was a sack of flour to feed my family? I haven't a clue. What would YOU do with only a sack of flour?

News from Thaxted Surgery

Life at Thaxted Surgery continues to be busy and varied!

We are delighted to see that we have been rated no 74 out of 6209 GP practices nationally, with 97% of patients rating us as good overall. Thank you to all our patients who took the time to complete and return the survey. However, we recognise that we do not always get it right and are always open to constructive suggestion and discussion about how and where we could improve. If you would like to get involved in supporting and working with the surgery our PPG (Patient Participation Group) is always on the lookout for new members. You can leave your details at Reception or email into the surgery on hweicbwe.f81131-reception@nhs.net with your details.

GP Registrar

We are sad to say that Dr Saye has now left us for his next training practice. We were very lucky to have "kept" him for a whole year and enjoyed teaching him and learning from him. We will be having another GP Registrar, but they won't be joining us until the new year. In the meantime, we will be welcoming back our annual year 6 medical students starting their six week rotations in October.

Changes Ahead

There are some changes ahead nationally that will affect us and all GP practices. We do not know how exactly we will be affected but we are watching and waiting. The immediate change affecting us is the reduction in the number of ICBs (Integrated Care Boards) and ICBs with bigger footprints being established. We are currently part of Herts and West Essex ICB but we will be moving into the new Greater Essex ICB.

Appointments

Between the 1st June and 30th June we had a total of 143 appointments which we had to record as **Did Not Attend (DNA)**. We do understand that sometimes there are circumstances beyond your control but where possible we ask that you notify the surgery if you are unable to attend an appointment or no longer need an appointment – that way we can release it and offer it to someone else.

How to contact us?

Do you know about the "contact us" portal on our website? This is for non-urgent clinical queries, sick note requests, and questions about investigation results and can be found on our usual website. Simply click on it and follow the steps https://www.thaxted-surgery.co.uk/

We still offer all the other access routes too – phone, in person, via email, online appointments.

Non NHS Work

Along with other surgeries Thaxted does sometimes undertake non-NHS work for patients – this work is not covered in our contract with the NHS and therefore is chargeable. This includes work such as private medicals, DVLA forms, certificates and some letters. Our fees have been static for many years, but we have recently had to increase them. The updated fees are on display in reception and on the website and have been in effect since 28th July. We now also ask for all work to be paid for in advance.

PPG (Patient Participation Group)

We are very fortunate to have a supportive PPG here at Thaxted and are very grateful for the monies raised by them over the year. We are currently planning on converting another room into a consultation room so all funds raised now and in future will be going towards this. As well as funds raised by the PPG, we have benefitted from donations from Hunts Charity that we used to purchase a new defibrillator and blood pressure machines.

Vaccine Clinics

Last but not least, we are approaching flu and covid time again. We are delighted to say that this year sees the return of the inhouse fluathon. We will be inviting all those eligible for flu to come in on Saturday 4th October – please keep the date free and book with us and support your local surgery.

There will be a covid clinic later on in October and this will be run as a joint clinic with the other 3 surgeries in our PCN. Eligible patients will receive an invite. Again, please can I urge you to support your local surgery and attend this.





Where are we going?

Revd Mark Hayes. Thaxted United Reformed Church


Among the greatest scientists of recent history Albert was Einstein. He was a man who was so focussed on his scientific work that neglected he often everything else. including his personal

appearance – as evidenced by the state of his hair!

On one occasion he was making a train journey out of town in order to get to a speaking engagement. As he sat, engrossed in his work, in his seat, the ticket collector stopped to punch his ticket.

Looking up in shock, Einstein realized he didn't know what he had done with his ticket. He began frantically searching through his coat pockets, and then his briefcase. Gently the ticket collector said, "We all know who you are, Dr. Einstein. I'm sure you bought a ticket. Don't worry about it."

But, as the ticket collector moved along, he looked back to see Einstein on his hands and knees searching under the seat for his ticket. The ticket collector walked back, "Dr Einstein, please don't worry about it. I know who you are and I'm sure you



would have bought a ticket." Exasperated, Einstein looked up and said, "I, too, know who I am. What I don't know is where I'm going."

Today, many people seem confused about

both who they are and where they are going. The mantra that "everything in Britain seems to be broken" is something I often hear. When we look around us, much that we see can feel depressing. All of this is happening at a time when there are significant changes in the world order. The current conflicts which rage so viciously are a heavy load for our collective hearts to bear. Suffering upon suffering and a seemingly relentless cycle of death and destruction leave us overcome with arief for our broken world.

Mark's gospel records an incident when a scribe, having watched Jesus arguing with the Pharisees and Sadducees, approaches Jesus with a question. He wants to know which of the more than 600 laws of Moses is the key that unlocks the meaning of the whole.

In his answer, Jesus brings together a verse from Deuteronomy,

"you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength,"

with a verse from Leviticus,

"Never seek revenge or cherish a grudge towards your kinsfolk; you shall love your neighbour as yourself."

There is little point in having our mouths full of scripture if our hearts are full of hate. Holiness shows itself separation. in love. not Wholehearted love God for translates into love for neighbour and creates community in the face of sectarian all that promotes mentalities and separatist practices.

We may feel overwhelmed and hopeless when we consider the battles raging around the world, and the devastating scenes of suffering may at times be too painful to watch but each one of us can make an effort to love our neighbour. We can each make a difference. Our freedom and way of life are expressed by how our communities come together to work for the common good.

At a time when so many pressures seek to pull us apart, we can hold fast to the command of Jesus to love our neighbour, be that our next-door neighbour, neighbours in our wider community, our country or humankind as a whole
